Last April, a woman named Jena contacted the staff at ARRI expressing interest in adopting Hal. Hal wasn't just any old cat; he had been at our shelter for almost a year and turned away by numerous adopters because he was FIV+. FIV stands for feline immunodeficiency virus.

This virus weakens a cat's immune system and makes it hard for the cat to fight off infection. Cats can live for years with it, but they need to be kept indoors, fed a healthy diet, and given prompt veterinary care for any health issues that arise. The virus is passed to other cats through bite wounds and is not contagious to humans or dogs.

take on any medical responsibilities that came along with

adopting him. Jena was pleasantly surprised when we told her that Hal was not on any medication, was in excellent health, and could live a long, healthy life with lots of love and care.

The only obstacle we had was her dog, Dexter, a Chihuahua mix. Not knowing if Hal could adjust to life with a dog, Jena had a plan to keep them separate if they were not instantaneous friends. After speaking to her veterinarian, she has since introduced another cat named Lammer to the family. Now all three animals hang out together when Jena is home, and Hal, who is now known as

Prince Hal, enjoys giving his feline sister kisses when she lets him, and has been nothing but a gentleman to her. Prince Hal loves his cat tree, which overlooks the deck, as well as birds, squirrels, mice, and some outdoor cats in the neighbor's yard. According to Jena "He is perfect."

Heidi's husband, Chris, and daughter, Allison, fell in love at first sight. In fact, both Layla and Allison cried when they had to part the first day. How could this family do anything but adopt this sweet girl?

Since the adoption, Layla has brought so much love and laughter into their home and has helped the family slow down and relax a bit more. According to Heidi, Ben has become so much more confident with dogs thanks to the Paws to Read program. Layla is teaching him responsibility and Ben has gained a lot of self-confidence since the adoption.




