A Success Story

Reuben and Tahini would not be here today without our **Bark and Ride transport program.**

Reuben, a 2 year old pitbull, was picked up as a southern stray. His ears had been cropped and were severely infected. He also appeared to have rickets, a disease of the bony growth plate which was evident by his stature and deformed legs.

Tahini was a 5 month old stray who had never been handled. After 6 weeks, she refused to socialize with her caretakers.

Reuben was very sweet and loving, however, his appearance and breed had been a turn off to most people. Tahini's lack of socialization had not moved her out to the adoption floor. Two very different dispositions, but time was running out and their fate was very uncertain. Our rescue partner alerted us about these two and we arranged for them to be transported safely to ARRI.

Upon arrival, Reuben was a charmer and became an immediate staff favorite. He had a gentle nature about him and would follow staff and potential adopters around for attention. His pictures would soon win over his new owners, who drove an hour and a half to the shelter after recently losing their pitbull of 13 years, and knew they could provide a loving home. Reuben has provided them with lots of love and laughs in return.

Tahini was found to be cat friendly and both staff and trainers immediately began confidence building; all



that was needed was a patient owner and maybe a dog as well to show her the ropes. Tahini picked her person-she bonded with **ARRI** staff member

Becky. However, with each new hurdle she overcame, it made it that more difficult for Becky to let her go to someone else. She is now enjoying life in Becky's home, along with both dog and cat siblings. Who knew she would soon be described as adventurous, loving and rambunctious!





FREEDOM FROM HUNGER AND THIRST

by ready access to fresh water and diet to maintain health and vigor



FREEDOM FROM DISCOMFORT

by providing an appropriate environment including shelter and a comfortable resting area



FREEDOM FROM PAIN, INJURY OR DISEASE

by prevention or rapid diagnosis and treatment



FREEDOM TO EXPRESS NORMAL BEHAVIOR

by providing sufficient space, proper facilities and company of the animal's own kind



FREEDOM FROM FEAR AND DISTRESS

by ensuring conditions and treatment which avoid mental suffering



DO YOU HAVE A COVID-19 PLAN FOR YOUR PET?

It is **essential** to include your furry family members in all your disaster preparedness and emergency planning.

Prepare a pet supply kit to include the following items:

- The name and contact information for your pet's temporary caregiver. Be sure to include their cell phone number, as well as a backup caregiver in case your first contact is no longer able to help.
- A 2-week supply of food, treats, medications (with directions), and any other supplies necessary to care for your pet. Don't forget cat litter/litter box, puppy pads, and cleaning supplies.
- A crate or carrier to transport your pet, leash/harness, blanket, and toys.
- Up-to-date vaccination records.
- Collars with ID tags (make sure your pet's microchip information is up to date).
- · Daily care instructions.
- · Contact information for your veterinary clinic.

It's important to plan now, even if you are feeling well.


